COUNSELOR'S CORNER

September Theme: College Readiness

College Readiness Checklist for Parents:

- Arrange for them to speak formally to a recent college grad. Help your student speak to a recent graduate and advise them on college and what they may have done differently.
- Teach them the ins-and-outs of college finances. Show them the importance of making the most out of their education, go beyond yearly tuition totals and review the cost breakdown of each individual class. Also show them the benefit that finishing in four years and how it will have an impact on their long-term financial future.
- Have them start building their network -- now. Encourage your student to get a part time job, attend college visits, job shadow, and participate in community service. Students learn a lot from these experiences and can make unexpected connections with key people.
- **Give them opportunities to practice critical thinking.** Help your students look at problems from different angles and help them brainstorm different solutions.
- **Help them learn to manage their time.** Encourage students to create their own calendar to keep track of appointments, assignments, and deadlines. Many students arrive at college not knowing how to manage their time effectively. Calendars allow students to stay on top of their schedule no matter where they are.
- Show them how to use social media appropriately. Be a good role model for social media. Employers and college admission reps look at social media.
